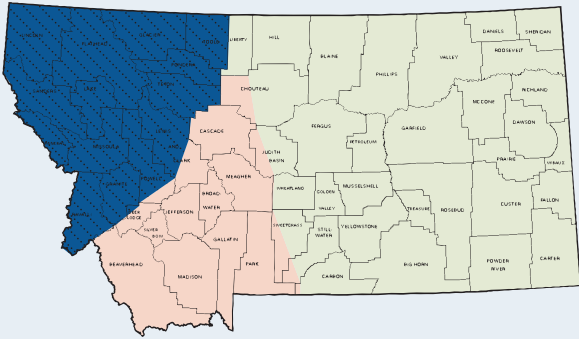

LARGEST WMA

The Blackfoot-Clearwater Wildlife Management Area is 43,761 acres. Montana’s largest WMA’s primary purpose is to protect deer and elk winter range.

SMALLEST WMA

The Roundhorn Wildlife Management Area is 27.1 acres. Montana’s smallest WMA provides critical winter/spring habitat to as many as 85-90 bighorn sheep from the Thompson Falls herd.
